Our clinical team uses scientifically proven ABA methods to bring about positive, meaningful changes in the lives of individuals with autism and other developmental disabilities. Our Behavior Technicians collaborate with our clinical team to implement an intervention plan catered to the individual's specific needs, while collecting observational data and sessions notes. ABA looks to reduce target behaviors and help clients develop new skills and more functional behaviors to foster the individual's independence.
