What to Expect as a Developmental Interventionist

Developmental Interventionists will be using a model of therapy referred DIR®/ Floortime™

D.I. R® which stands for **Developmental, Individual Difference, Relationship-based** modality. Some of the techniques used with children are referred to as Floortime™ which is a specific technique to both follow the child's natural emotional interests (lead) and at the same time challenge the child towards mastery of the social, emotional, and intellectual capacities. For teens and adults, we also assess them through a D.I. R® lens but when targeting adaptive domains, we incorporate a person-centered approach to motivate, empower, and ensure the individual is respected by providing choices. Depending on the stage of development, interest, and targeted goals we may use toys, games, sensory motor activities, social-emotional dyadic lessons and teach life skills, self-care, play skills, social skills, and communication.
